## TO HELP PRESERVE & PROTECT KEUKA LAKE

Leave your grass a little longer > 3"

Fewer mowings promotes a healthier lawn with deeper roots, less watering

Keep pesticides away from the lake

Pesticides can upset natural balance of ecosystem in watershed

Utilize fertilizer according to manufacturer instructions

Prevents nitrogen and phosphorous from entering watershed

Properly maintain your septic system – inspect and pump, per the law Prevents harmful bacteria from entering watershed

Dispose of chemicals properly – never dump in the lake or septic Chemicals can harm animal and plant life in watershed

Landscape using porous surfaces and rain gardens

Increased use helps filter pollutants and prevents erosion of hillsides

Use native plants in your gardening

Native plants naturally flourish in our region and act as filters to runoff

Dispose of pet waste properly

Prevents harmful bacteria from entering watershed

Become a volunteer to monitor and report harmful algal blooms Helps provide valuable data to prevent future outbreaks
