



KLA ANNOUNCES ESTHER N. WAHLIG WATERSHED ENDOWMENT SCHOLARSHIP

In February, 2007, the Wahlig family requested that the KLA Board approve a scholarship in memory of Esther N. Wahlig to be offered to students in the Keuka Lake area and members of KLA families. A committee was formed to work out the details and confirm the legalities of the offer. The KLA Board approved the scholarship in September. The goal of this annual scholarship is to assist a graduating senior high school student who is planning to enroll in a four-year program (may include a two-year college student with plans to transfer to a four-year institution) and who is planning on pursuing a career in general environmental studies or limnology or water quality/watershed management. The scholarship will be offered to students in Dundee Central School District, Hammondsport Central School District and Prattsburg Central School District. If approved by the Boards of Education of Haverling Central School District (Bath) and Penn Yan Central School District, the scholarship will be offered to students in these districts as well.

In 1999, an endowment fund was established in memory of Esther N. Wahlig to honor her love for Keuka Lake. Interest from the fund was designated to be used primarily for educational purposes. These funds now enable the KLA to offer this yearly, one time only, scholarship of \$1000. Please see enclosed application for further details.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

You will be reading this letter in the Thanksgiving, Christmas, and New Years holiday season, traditionally a time for reflection, giving thanks and celebration. As I look back on 2007 through the KLA lens, I feel we have substantial reasons to do all three.

Lake Level

I have had several KLA members comment on how well the lake level has been managed this year. Of course, we had no killer storms and their related massive water dumps, but instead had the opposite, a very dry summer. Yet the lake level was managed in a way to keep in within the guide curve as much as possible and as long as possible given these dry conditions. We can thank Bill Weber (chairman of the Keuka Lake Outlet Compact (KLOC) and Ed Balsley (Penn Yan Public Works Manager) for their consistent efforts to keep the lake within the guide.

Water Quality

Our measures continue to show that Keuka Lake is holding its own in terms of all the quality measures. Of course we can thank Al Wahlig, Peter Landre (CCE) and their monthly boating team for taking the measurements that are the backbone of our water quality monitoring program. And we also need to recognize the Keuka Watershed Improvement Cooperative (KWIC) and Watershed Manager, Paul Bauter, for their continuing efforts to guide the septic inspection program. help from KLA, KWIC hired a summer intern to revamp and publish an inspection procedures document. Moreover, KWIC has been meeting with the township inspectors to encourage keeping annual inspections up to date and even making some progress on reducing the backlog of delayed inspections. Furthermore, KWIC is in the process of revamping a handheld data entry system to speed the inspection data recording process, eventually making the data entry less time consuming and more current. Next year we can foresee KWIC again using a summer intern to help reduce the backlog and implementing the updated data entry system.

Special Recognition KLOC and KWIC members

Two of the original members of the KLOC and KWIC boards will be leaving their posts this year. Tom Chadwick will no longer be an Urbana town councilman and so will be retiring from his leadership position as chairman of the KWIC board. Tom has been a long term believer in inter-municipal cooperation and, therefore, a consistent source of support for the valuable work of KWIC in maintaining Keuka Lake water quality. Jack Snow will be retiring from his position as Milo Supervisor and will, then, also retire from his position on the KWIC and KLOC boards. Jack has also done an excellent job as KWIC treasurer while on the board. Thankfully, he has agreed to stay involved by doing the Treasurer duties for the reconstituted KWIC board.

Docks and Moorings Implementation

This is our first year of operating under the new uniform D&M regulations. All municipalities report that the implementation of this new law has gone smoothly.

Twenty new permanent docks were built on Keuka Lake, all within regulations with no variances required. Many thanks to the Municipal Code Enforcement Officers who learned the regulations and provided advice for local residents and to the Intern-municipal D&M team who continued to be available for consultation and tracking.

KLA Membership

Finally, I would thank you as KLA members for your continuing support. Our membership is at an all time high (over 1800) thanks to the continuing efforts of Bill Laffin and the KLA membership committee. Having a strong membership base is key to KLA's being an effective voice in maintaining and improving the quality of Keuka Lake and its watershed.

KLA Operations

For those who have called or e-mailed our office, the "voice" you encounter is bound to be our administrative assistant, Margo McTaggart. Again this year, she has done a superb job in responding to our public and keeping us on track in many ways.

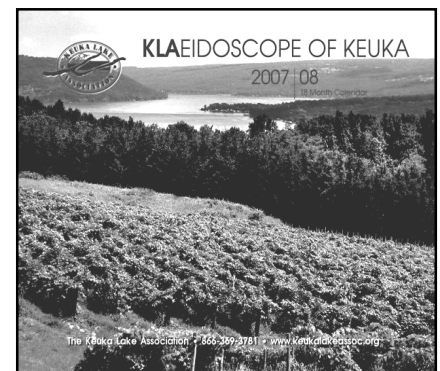
LAST CALL! **Kaleidoscope of Keuka Calendar & Photo Contest**

2007 has been an extraordinary year for the KLA's membership activities. At the close of 2006, we had a total membership of about 1550. This included lakeshore members, business members and non lake members. At the close of 2007, we have a total membership of about 1850. A 19% increase in membership exceeded all of our expectations and has set a very high standard for 2008.

Overall, 51% of the approximate 2875 lakeside property owners are KLA members. As you can see, there is still plenty of opportunity for all of us to actively recruit new members. In addition, we have recruited many new business members in 2007. An updated list of our business members is in the back section of the newsletter. Please patronize our business members and let them know that you appreciate their belonging to the KLA.

At the KLA's Annual Meeting in July, we asked those in attendance for their input on increasing membership. Your insight and ideas have been very much appreciated and will be incorporated into our membership campaign strategies. Keuka Lake "Got Foam" - Cause for Concern?

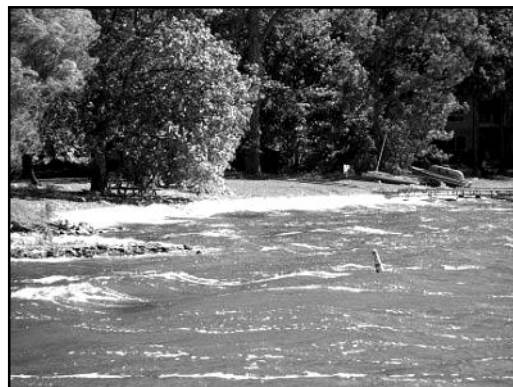

Keuka Lake, along with all freshwater lakes, have always had some level of natural "foam" from wave action combined with organic matter that acts as a surfactant or foaming agent. Since 2001 we have seen at times, larger scaled foam episodes in some parts of the lake. Water samples taken from the lake indicate the foam is a natural occurring substance consistent with the decomposition of a large die-off of zebra mussels and algae. The foam is not a health concern for swimming or drinking water.

What is the cause of lake foam and why are we seeing higher amounts? The white foam found in lakes and streams is usually natural. Wind-driven currents frequently create parallel streaks of foam in open water. Foam is created as decomposing plants and animals release organic compounds into the water. The compounds act as a "surfactant" and reduce the surface tension of water, causing bubbles to form. Many people blame shoreline foam on detergents, but detergents don't create long-lasting foam since they quickly lose their sudsing ability. Natural foam has a somewhat earthy or fishy aroma. Detergent foam, in contrast, will have a noticeable perfume smell.

The "lines" of foam that occur are caused by "langmuir" currents. These currents are formed on the sides of wind-driven waves causing a "funneling" action and the characteristic windrow of surface foam and other debris. The windrows will be more pronounced on a windy, southerly front (as seen in the photo on the right on 9/28/05).

Editor's note: This article and others on the subject of "foam" in the lake have appeared several times in past issues of the KLA newsletter and on our website. However, each year in the fall, we get inquiries on the subject so we asked Peter to repeat this article.



Results from the 2007 annual meeting survey

During KLA's Annual Meeting in July, attendees were invited to complete a brief questionnaire regarding the KLA and our activities. The input received not only reinforced the priorities the KLA has been focusing on, but it also raised some new ideas and issues to help guide our future work.

Overall satisfaction was high with 93% of the respondents indicating they were either satisfied or very satisfied with the KLA's programs and accomplishments.

Many helpful comments were received in response to the following questions:

1. *Are there things KLA is doing that you feel we should improve or do more?*
2. *Are there things KLA does NOT do that you feel we should do?*
3. *How can we increase our membership to include as many property owners on the lake and watershed as possible, plus other interested parties?*

Many of the answers to questions 1 and 2 emphasized the overall satisfaction with KLA and are typified by "Keep up the good work". In addition, several key themes emerged. These are listed below in order of the number of people who commented on the issue.

Septic & Sewage Systems: Support for improved septic system inspection processes plus advocacy for sanitary sewers around the lake.

Zoning & Land Use: Support for responsible land use and development within the watershed plus influence on zoning practices that impact the lake, such as "key-holing."

Water Quality: Support for water quality monitoring and providing information about human activity and natural occurrences that impact water quality.

Communications: Satisfaction with current KLA communications plus suggestions for improvement (e.g. website, emails, getting information to renters).

Noise on the Lake: Annoyance and concern about excessively loud boats and jet-skis. Support for more aggressive enforcement of noise ordinances.

Liaison with Local Government: Involvement with local governments and pushing for specific areas of action (e.g. taxes, law enforcement, lake level management).

It is encouraging to see that all of these issues are consistent with current KLA priorities and activities. In addition many ideas surfaced for increased emphasis on particular issues and new initiatives within existing programs. The Membership Committee also received several useful suggestions on ways to increase membership.

This feedback has been extremely helpful to the KLA Board and all of the issues above have sparked lively discussions and new initiatives by the KLA Board and Committees. We will continue to seek

ESTHER N. WAHLIG KEUKA LAKE WATERSHED SCHOLARSHIP

The goal of this annual scholarship, sponsored by the Keuka Lake Association, is to assist a graduating senior high school student who is planning to enroll in a four year program (may include a two year college with plans to transfer to a four year institution) and who is planning on pursuing a career in general environmental sciences or limnology or water quality/watershed management.

The one-time \$1000 scholarship will be awarded in one installment upon satisfactory completion of the first semester and submission of a transcript sent to the Keuka Lake Association office for review by the committee.

The selection committee is composed of five members appointed by the Keuka Lake Association and will meet in April of the student's graduating year. The committee must receive application forms by April fifteenth of the graduating year. By June first the committee will send the selected recipient a letter and forward a copy to the guidance department of the appropriate school.

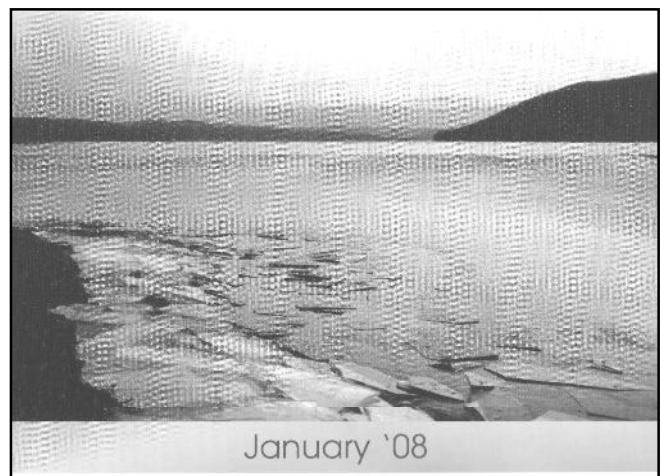

Watershed Development and Wildlife Part IV - Dave deCalesta

Parts I, II and III described wildlife habitat requirements within the Keuka Lake watershed from a landscape perspective. Part IV explores ways of enhancing/preserving essential wildlife habitats within the Keuka Lake watershed while weighing perspectives of different categories of landowners: farmland owners; forestland owners; lakefront homeowners; upland homeowners; and public land managing agencies. The underlying premise is that for a diverse wildlife community to thrive within the Keuka Lake watershed, there need to be large, interconnected blocks of forestlands containing diverse assemblages of tree and shrub species in different successional stages (shrub lands, small diameter trees, larger diameter trees, old maturing forests), from ridgetop to lakeshore. The challenge is to meet the needs of the complex variety of landowners while addressing the habitat needs of diverse wildlife communities within the Keuka Lake watershed.

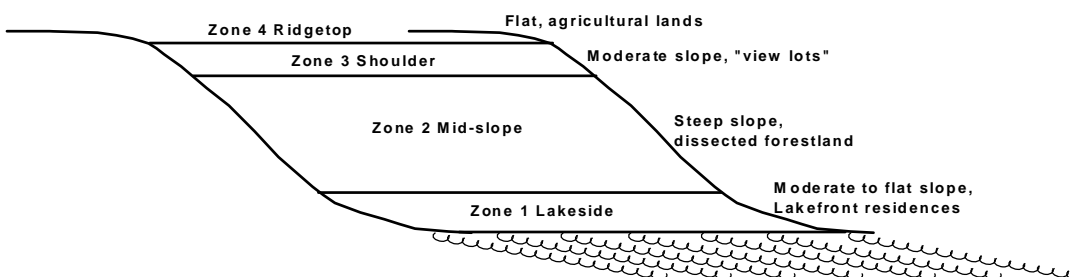


Figure 1. Land zones in the Keuka Lake watershed.

A first perspective is the physical characteristic of the land: the slope (steepness), soil type, exposure, and dissection (flat with wide meandering streams or steep with narrow plunging streams and waterfalls). These physical characteristics, which may be classified in zones within the Keuka Lake watershed (See Fig. 1 below), determine the degree of attractiveness of lands to each of the landowner categories *and to wildlife*.

Zone 1, Lakeside, is moderately-sloped to flat land, at the interface of the lake and forestland. It is the most attractive for lakefront homeowners and is also of high value to wildlife as the riparian interface connecting lake and forest. Lakeside lands are the final barrier to soil erosion and run-off for the lake.

Zone 2, Mid-slope, is the steepest, heavily dissected, and heavily forested. This is the biggest block of watershed land, and of high importance to wildlife because of the large contiguous forest blocks and the variety of habitats. Steepness and requirement for forest clearing make these lands less attractive to upland homeowners. Mid-slope forestland is an important filter strip above the lake, catching rain and snow run-off, preventing erosion and siltation, and acting as a sponge, holding and releasing water slowly over time, reducing potential for flooding, and lengthening the period of water flow in dry periods. Lower potential for residential development, lower tax rates, and larger blocks of contiguous forestland make these lands attractive to forest landowners.

Zone 3, Shoulder, is the narrow band of forest/farm land sandwiched between the flat ridgetops and steeper sloping land. It is prized for upland homeowners for the spectacular views of Keuka Lake and sheltering forestland. Shoulder lands are valuable for growing grapes and fruits, and connect farmlands and forestland for wildlife.

Zone 4, Ridgetop, is the broad, flat land on hill tops. Ridgetops are easily farmed and of high value to farm landowners. Upland homeowners like them too for the vistas and openness. Primarily farmland, ridgetops are important to "farmland" wildlife.

The second perspective is existing development. The degree to which land is “developed” or converted from original forestland to other uses (farming, residences, commercial) determines value to humans, impact on wildlife, and forms a basis for potential actions to maintain/enhance habitat and wildlife and to protect water quality in the lake.

Lakeside: The most heavily developed and impacted zone from a wildlife perspective is the thin strip of waterfront consisting of side-by-side residences with driveways, lawns, and developed beaches that have nearly eliminated the *riparian* habitat of emergent vegetation (cattails, water lilies, sedges, sphagnum moss),

water-loving trees, leaf and other persistent ground litter, and snags and logs (in the water as well as on the land adjacent to the water). One never, or rarely, sees wildlife that inhabit the forest-lake edge like otters, minks, muskrats, beavers, turtles, snakes, frogs and salamanders, loons, grebes, rails, bitterns, ospreys, eagles, and wood ducks.

Ridgetop and Shoulder: The next most developed part of the watershed is agricultural/forest lands on gentler slopes, spanning the range of grazing and grass/hay growing, vineyards, and vegetable and fruit crops. Developed at the expense of contiguous forestlands, Ridgetop and Shoulder lands none-the-less comprise unique wildlife habitats in themselves, filling some if not all the habitat needs of the “farmland” wildlife community (pheasants, deer, rabbits, doves and turkeys). Current farming practices emphasize proper use of chemicals (fertilizers, herbicides) to minimize/eliminate impact on soils, vegetation and wildlife.

Mid-slope: The least developed part, and comprising the largest block of existing forestland, is the land between the lake shore residential band of development and the ridgetop/shoulder forest/farm land. It is within this block that most wildlife species fulfill their habitat needs – some are found only within the large contiguous forest blocks, others utilize farmlands and/or lakeshore habitats as part of habitats that must also include contiguous forestland.

The last perspective – ownership exchanges. The tie that connects kinds of development with the physical characteristic of the land, and the way by which habitat and wildlife may be enhanced, is what happens when lands are exchanged, *and where these lands lie within the Keuka Lake watershed.*

No exchange: 1) public lands such as National Forest lands (Think Finger Lakes National Forest on the east side of Seneca Lake) and NY Department of Environmental Conservation forest lands (think state forests such as Pigtail Hollow and Urbana State forests on the south east side of Keuka Lake) remain as forestlands managed for multiple benefits, including wildlife and wildlife habitat; 2) farmlands are sold and continue to be managed as farmlands; and, 3) forest lands are sold and continue to be managed as forest lands. No actions are needed for **No Exchanges**, except maintenance of existing status: continued encouragement for retention of public and private forest and farmlands.

Lakefront Exchanges: change in ownership of residential lands on the lakefront. When these lands change hands the only existing protection for habitat (and water quality in the lake) is when existing septic systems must pass inspection before exchanges may occur. For residences on community sewage systems, there are no actions to enhance habitat. The highest negative impact occurs where single dwelling residential lots are converted to multiple dwelling condominium lots.

Potential actions in this zone include regulation of conversions from single to multiple dwelling status, converting areas of lawns to areas of trees, replacing groomed beaches and breakwalls with emergent vegetation, and slowing run-off from roofs and driveways by catching run-off in "rain gardens" (information on "rain gardens" in last issue of KLA Newsletter) For these latter actions to occur, there need to be economic incentives ("tax breaks") to reward habitat enhancement and training for how-to-do information.

Ridgetop, Slope, and Mid-slope Exchanges: Greatest potential for negative impact is where forest and farmlands are converted to residential developments ("view lots"), with loss of wildlife habitat. Exchanges that guarantee maintenance/enhancement of wildlife habitat are: 1) conservation easements whereby landowners are sometimes granted reduced taxes or other economic incentives to retain their lands in farm/forest management and, 2) outright land purchases by organizations such as the Finger Lakes Land Trust or the Nature Conservancy which keep or sell the lands to agencies that will manage the land as farm/forestland. Forest landowners might be encouraged to retain mid-slope areas as forestlands with tax incentives for retaining land in forest and with educational programs for creating additional sources of revenue from sustainable uses of wood products. Other potential actions in these zones include requiring minimum acreages for residential lots, and changing tax structure of converted lands at the time of transfer to reflect real estate value of "view" lots. Increased tax rates for converted lots might be off-set by tax reductions for retaining forest/shrubland on residential lots rather than conversion to lawns or other non farmland, non forestland types.

Developing a consistent framework for designing and implementing actions to preserve/enhance habitat, wildlife, and water quality in the various Keuka Lake Watershed zones will require communication, cooperation, and coordination among the many affected publics: forest landowners, farm landowners, lakeside and upland homeowners, landowner associations, developers, and township, county, and land-managing agencies and administrations. Without such a framework and resulting forest and farm land conservation/enhancement actions, habitat, wildlife, and water quality may decline to unacceptable levels in the future in the Keuka Lake Watershed.

CRITTER CORNER

Get Ready for Spring - Dave deCalesta

Most people are pretty much unaware of how much wildlife there is around Keuka Lake, right on the lake, the hills surrounding the lake, and in the countless streams draining into the lake. As the snowflakes are falling this winter consider some steps to increase your knowledge, appreciation, and interaction with wildlife next spring-summer-fall.

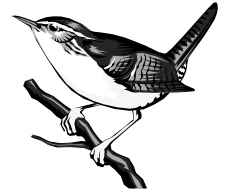
Increase your awareness. – There are numerous excellent field guides for birds, mammals, and reptiles and amphibians in local bookstores. All have identification guides, pictures, and descriptions of habitat, including nesting (for birds). Pick one up to read over winter, get a few as Holiday presents to give to friends and family. That way, come spring, you'll know what to look for, and where.

Start a journal/log. - An old trick to jog our memories, and keep track of significant sightings, obtain a diary/journal type notebook with blank pages and begin to use it to note observations of wildlife, and associated dates and weather conditions. Now I can go back and remember when and where I saw that Bald Eagle in March of '06, and the old squaw (rare duck) in April of '05.

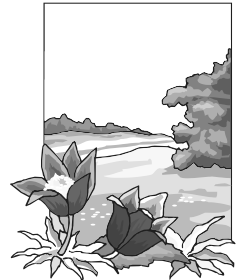

Learn to identify birds by their songs. - Male songbirds sing in the spring to establish breeding territories and attract mates. Each species has a distinctive and usually beautiful song. There are bird tapes available for self learning. The Cornell Ornithology Lab in Ithaca (www.birds.cornell.edu) sells these tapes and provides guided tours of its woodlot (Sapsucker Woods) for beginners. Tapes are also available through the Audubon Society. Get a tape, gift one to a friend or family member, and be prepared for a whole new world out there. There are similar tapes for breeding croaks/peeps/trills for frogs and toads.



Get equipped. - Nothing brings that little tweetybird closer for a positive I.D. than a good pair of binoculars. Digital zoom cameras are cheaper all the time, and it's good to record visually the critters you see with the written description of what, where, and when.

Plan wildlife jaunts. - Organize hikes that combine treks to spots with vistas/overlooks with different wildlife habitats and different critters. The outlet trail from Penn Yan to Dresden is a great day hike: in May there is a profusion of wildflowers (trillium, wild geranium, Indian cucumberroot, starflower) and critters: in the early morning hours in spring the gorge is filled with birdsong, and later in the day there are dozens of turtles sunning themselves on logs in the bogs along the trail. Digging around in the sphagnum moss and leaf litter and turning over flat stones and logs in land surrounding any of the gorges feeding creeks into Keuka Lake will turn up interesting salamanders.

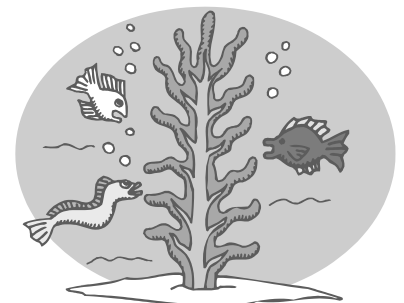


Call in the big boys. - More and more, people are spotting bobcats, coyotes and bears in the hills surrounding Keuka Lake. Got to any local sporting goods store and get a rabbit squealer/predator call. Get the tape that goes with it, and practice a bit. Come spring, you'll be able to go out on the ridgetops at dusk/dawn and call up a fox-coyote-bobcat-bear. Surprisingly, deer will also come running to these calls. Bring along the camera.

Rebuild/clean birdhouses and feeders. - Those martin birdhouses that never get martins? Take them down and clean out the years of accumulated nesting materials. Refurbish the bird feeders and bird houses. Invest in a couple of books that describe the best kind of bird feeder/bird house for the different birds and get a couple for the Holiday season as gifts.



Diversify your environment. - Most lake front properties are wildlife-free zones. No habitat. To increase your lakefront critters, replace the grass with cattails and sedges at the water's edge. Instead of covering up aquatic weeds off the end of the dock with black plastic, leave a few patches of weeds for the bluegills, perch, bass, and bullheads. Outback, if you have a woodlot, don't cut down snags or clear up all the wood on the ground, it's valuable wildlife habitat. If you have a big lawn, consider converting it back to forest. Install a rain garden to collect rainwater, rather than shunt it directly into the lake with drains. Temporary wetted areas in rain gardens do not promote mosquitoes, they don't stay wet long, they just act as sponges to temporarily store water.
